Kids Growing Program

In early spring, 632 students walked to Allan Gardens Children's Conservatory for an engaging planting session plus the popular tour of the facility. 4,139 children from 15 elementary schools and community day camps learned to plant, harvest and enjoy fresh garden foods. Programs support curriculum objectives and provide healthy summer activities for young children. Core staff were supported by 17 post-secondary students on placements from five different institutions, supporting skill development in community work, nursing and teaching. We were also excited to build up our Urban Trees from Seed project (cover image, Ohemaa with the Kentucky Coffeetree seedlings to transplant).

Our core staff team expanded in 2019 to include a position for Indigenous Education. We had fantastic volunteer support from a pair of Toronto Public Health nurses, who joined us in greenhouse and gardens promoting nutrition.
